And when we meet someone who is suffering from this pain, we need to stay with them and listen. But when we get up to go, it's important not to carry their pain with us.

So, she said, I am grateful for the opportunity for us to talk and pray, but please leave my pain here, don't carry it with you.

I promised her that I wouldn't, and we agreed that we had given her pain to God to transform into her new life.
