RE Susan Skoglund gave report highlighting a few areas of the Quarter 2 **REPORT OF SYNOD** Financial Reports (Attachment 2). TREASURER She pointed out the summary information on packet page 41 and drew attention to the per capita line which is low year to date. The Synod will need to pull about \$75,000 more from Wilshire Reserve by the end of the year for the operating expenses. Elder Skoglund pointed out that only 2 grants have been given during 2021. She raised this so presbytery executives would be aware of what is available. In addition to the written report (Attachment 3), Wendy Tajima reviewed **REPORT OF** the rewrite of the Synod Finance Policies. (Attachment 4) FINANCE COMMITTEE The body reviewed the policies. Some minor edits were suggested. It was VOTED to recommend the revised Finance Policies to the Synod Assembly. The Finance Committee was given the authority to make editorial changes to the document as discussed in the meeting. It was VOTED that the Synod inform PILP that the Synod will only sign off on PILP loan applications for which the Synod is a guarantor. Lee Ireland brought up the philosophy of how we invest. The Commission discussed ways to approach reviewing the Synod's mission as part of this. It was VOTED to have Mark Hong start the process and bring to CoA a suggested process for a strategic team formation for thinking about the mission and vision for the next 5 years and for Mark Hong to report back to next CoA meeting. **REPORT OF** Suzanne Malloy assumed the responsibility of presiding so that Chair Pat Niles could present on behalf of the Personnel Committee. The PERSONNEL committee's primary responsibility was to do the annual staff reviews. Via COMMITTEE Zoom, the Personnel Committee had individual appointments with each staff member. The Personnel Committee brought the following motions as a result of their work. It was VOTED that the 2022 compensation for the four synod employees be increased by 6%, (5% for COLA and 1% merit). It was VOTED that the three exempt employees be given an annual \$300.00 allowance toward internet fees at their home, now that the synod is a virtual office.

It was VOTED that a \$400.00 Study Leave allowance be added for the REPL Coordinator position.

REPORT OF BUDGET The Budget Task Force was appointed by the CoA Chair per the Synod COMMITTEE Finance Policies (Revision 2009). A new format for the budget was presented which split out the Special Funds Projections from the Operating Budget. Per capita is staying at \$2.85 per church member. Chair Niles explained some of the significant lines of the budget. The budget is Attachment 5.

> It was VOTED that Commission of Assembly recommend that Synod Assembly approve the 2022 Synod Budget and 2022 Special Funds Projections with the corrections need to change Worker's Comp line and balance the budget.

> On behalf of Budget Task Force, it was VOTED that CoA request that Restricted and Special Funds Committee (a) review and determine if the following "Pass through Grants" could and should be changed to direct the funds directly to the recipient organizations:

- A. Witness for Peace
- B. Union Station Foundation
- C. Franciscan Friars
- D. La Casa de San Gabriel Community Center

and (b) report back to COA by the June 2022 meeting." Moved, seconded.

For information - these are endowment funds invested with the Presbyterian Foundation.

Pat Niles resumed her role as chair of the Commission at the conclusion of her report.
